s the Northern Beaches major water safety and rescue organisation, our primary role is to save lives. Across our 21 Clubs from Manly to North Palm Beach, more than 7000 volunteers patrol our beaches every weekend and public holidays for the season from the beginning of the September school holidays to the end of the April school holidays each year. Patrol requirements are detailed in the Club's Lifesaving Service Agreement and the SLSNSW Public Safety Standard Operating Procedures. Each Club also has a Patrol Operations Manual that details their Club's specific requirements. which should be available to all patrolling members.



BECOMING A LIFESAVER

Members of the public who wish to become a lifesaver, patrolling our beaches, can do so by joining one of our surf clubs and achieving the Bronze Medallion award (Certificate II in Public Safety Aquatic Rescue) from the age of 15. Younger members can also patrol by completing the Surf Rescue Certificate (SRC) from the age of 13 years old. Junior members registered as part of our Nipper program will complete the SRC when they are in the Under 14 age group and begin patrolling from then.

Once one of these minimum awards has been achieved, your career as a volunteer lifesaver has just begun. Members can go on to complete other awards such as First Aid, Advanced Resuscitation Techniques, Radio Operator, IRB Crew, Silver Medallion Patrol Captain, Silver Medallion Aquatic Rescue, Silver Medallion IRB Driver and even the pinnacle award, the Gold Medallion. For those who feel they may not have the physical attributes to be a lifesaver, there is a place for them on patrol as well. Some members choose to start with a First Aid certificate and patrol as an "Award Member". Sometimes even improving their skills by completing more advanced awards such as Advanced Resuscitation Techniques.

TRAINING COURSES

There are many qualifications available to SLS members, including the ability to become a Training Officer or Assessor in certain awards. Education within SNB is



part of the SLSNSW Registered Training Organisation (RTO) and many of the courses offered are nationally accredited qualifications that are recognised outside Surf Life Saving.

Each Club has their own calendar of training for Club based awards such as SRC, Bronze Medallion, Advanced Resuscitation, IRB Crew and Silver Medallion IRB Driver. Other courses, such as Silver Medallion Patrol Captain and Silver Medallion Aquatic Rescue, are run by the Branch. The SNB Education calendar can be found on the SNB website and is advertised in our weekly e-newsletter, Week in Review. Members wishing to complete any Branch run courses should speak to their Club's Chief Training Officer (CTO) first.

ASSESSMENTS

The Bronze Medallion, SRC and ART awards are assessed at Central Venue locations in our Branch. This ensures consistency and transparency in all our assessments and makes the best use of our available Assessors' time. There are booking procedures in place for all the Award assessments, and they should be coordinated through the Branch office by the Club's CTO.

EDUCATION SUMMIT DAY

The SNB Summit Training Day is a professional development day held in August each year. The summit focuses on Trainers, Assessors & Facilitators and includes training in lifesaving CPR, skills and scenarios, networking, and other hands-



on activities. The day is for SNB TAFs to enhance their skills and knowledge before the season commences.

SKILLS MAINTENANCE

Training our lifesavers is the first step. Ensuring they remain current and competent is an annual task. With a few exceptions, most awards are required to be updated annually at skills maintenance sessions run by the Clubs. Skills maintenance sessions should be conducted prior to 31st December each year and members' records must be updated within 2 weeks. We advise that any paper records should be stored securely at the Club and available for cross-reference during the season if required.

Successful completion of annual Skills Maintenance may include some theory tasks via eLearning. Members should ensure they are aware of all the individual requirements (based on the awards they hold) and complete all theory tasks in the required time periods. Incomplete theory tasks may result in members' awards not being updated for the season.

Any member who is NOT proficient by 31st December, or has NOT completed the appropriate awards shall NOT be allowed to:



- Perform patrols
- Operate rescue craft or
- Compete in Surf Life Saving competitions

Members who are unable to complete their proficiencies by 31st December due exceptional circumstances, must apply to their Club for permission to complete a late proficiency. If given Club approval, Club Captains must then apply to the Branch in writing giving as much detail as possible. Members who wish to compete and have not yet completed their annual skills maintenance, may need to gain Branch and State approval before progressing.

SURFCOM / CHANNEL 3

Channel 3 communications is our primary working channel for communication between the Clubs and the State Operations Centre. Channel 3 must be kept clear of non-urgent traffic. Channel 2 should be used for communication between patrol members. Radio communications for water safety, laying buoys and training should be conducted on the training channels. Personal information must not be broadcast over any radio channels.

SUPPORT OPERATIONS

This is a collective term for surf lifesaving activities that provide support to our patrol members. They include Duty Officers, RWC

Operators, UAV Operators, Patrol Review Officers and Trauma Incident Peer Support (TIPS) team.

AFTER HOURS DUTY OFFICER

The role of the After Hours Duty Officer is to act as the delegated authority of all lifesaving operations within the Branch on a 24/7 roster. The AHDO coordinates with Emergency Services and activates club's emergency call-out teams and Branch support operations as required. The AHDOs can also be tasked to work with other Emergency Services during major disasters or events. The AHDO's have senior Emergency Management training and experience in Branch support operations.

DUTY OFFICERS (DO)

Our Duty Officers are patrolling the Branch during patrol hours. They are available to assist Patrol Captains in the co-ordination of major incidents, rescues and liaise with other Emergency Services and the media during patrol hours. Duty Officers have already had a substantial amount of experience managing their beach as a Patrol Captain before applying to join the DO team. They also hold a number of other qualifications beyond the Branch will open applications for new Duty Officers, outlining the requirements.





RWC OPERATORS

Rescue Water Craft (RWC) Operators are otherwise known as the let ski operators. The RWCs provide increased surveillance and rapid response in high-risk and unpatrolled areas. Sydney Northern Beaches operates RWC's out of multiple locations, enabling us to patrol from Blue Fish Point near Manly in the south to Patonaa in the north. SNB runs one RWC training program a year, during the winter months when the iet skis are not being used for patrol. Any member who holds the required qualifications and has the required experience is welcome to apply. Applications generally open towards the end of the season and include detailed information on the minimum requirements.



TIPS

Member welfare is very important to us and our TIPS team (Trauma Incident Peer Support) provides a debriefing and support service to members involved in a critical incident. The team can provide a group debrief, personal support and can refer members for professional assistance if required. Access to the TIPS team is normally arranged by rostered Duty Officer or AHDO. A Traumatic Incident brochure can be downloaded from the website.

PATROL REVIEW CHECKS

As SLSNSW is a recognised as an Emergency Service under the State Emergency Rescue Management Act 1989, we need to undertake an auditing



process to ensure we meet the required standards as an Emergency Service. Our small team of Patrol Review Officers help to monitor patrol standards set by SLSA, SLSNSW and the Office of Emergency Services, as well as providing feedback to Clubs to enable them to monitor their own standards. Each member of the team is an experienced lifesaver and has significant experience in Surf Life Saving and auditing processes. The team will conduct reviews at all 21 Clubs on at least 4 occasions per season; once by each member of the Review team. Individual review results are confirmed by email with the relevant Club Captain and Patrol Captain, and recorded at Branch HQ

UAV'S (UNMANNED AERIAL VEHICLE)

The Branch operates four UAV's at both fixed locations and in the Surf Rescue response vehicles for quick deployment. The UAV's are used for beach surveillance, search and rescues and any taskings required by Emergency Services. The Branch will be running training for UAV pilots from time to time. UAV pilots don't need to be qualified patrol members but do need to complete a UAV course and radio operator's course. The UAV program falls under the Branch Support Operations and is coordinated by the SNB Branch UAV Advisor.

SURF SPORTS

ourf Sports on the Northern Beaches is run by the SNB Board of Surf Sports (BoSS). The Board is chaired by the Director of Surf Sports. The rest of the Board is made up of another 10 voting members, each of whom represent a certain area of surf sports: Craft, R&R, Lifesavina, High Performance etc. We pride ourselves in ensuring each area of surf sports has a voice on the Board and together as a group, are the controlling body for all SLS competition at SNB. The Surf Sports officer is a paid employee who acts as support for the Board in all Surf Sports matters and should be the first point of call for all SNB members.

OFFICIALS

Becoming an Official is now much easier

than ever with the online course. Anybody looking to become an Official will need to log on to the members area and head to the e-learning section where you can choose between Core Official and Technical Official. There are limitations on what roles you can take according to the type of Official you are.

COACHES

Coaching courses are also online and like the Official's courses are available through the e-Learning section of the Members' hub. Upon completion of the online course the requirements for each level of accreditation (Foundation,

Development, Performance) vary but all involve a practical component that needs to be signed off by a designated coaching mentor. For more information on becoming a coach and the reaccreditation process go to the SLSSNB website and head to the coaching tab under surf sports.

CARNIVALS

All carnivals are run by the SLSSNB BoSS with clubs acting as hosts for their respective events. Carnivals are run under the SLSA Surf Sports Manual rules. Clubs that wish to host a carnival must nominate in writing to the BoSS and must ensure all the relevant paperwork is completed before the carnival can be approved. There is a Code of Conduct for all carnival goers relating to the way in which competitors, officials,

team managers and spectators must behave. Carnivals are supposed to be fun and any abuse of anybody taking part will not be tolerated.

Competitors MUST wear pink Hi-Viz vests when competing in any water events. Anybody not wearing one will not be allowed to start the race. Gear and equipment for carnivals is supplied by SLSSNB in the form of all buoys, anchors, tents, poles, tracks. Anything outside of the course set up is supplied by the host Club. Clubs are required to provide officials and water safety in order for carnivals to run properly. For Junior Carnivals and Branch Championships your officials and water safety quotas will be based on your Club's entries as a percentage of overall entries. If



your Club is 10% of overall entries you will be asked to provide 10% of officials and water safety Entries will be done this season via LiveHeats. Details of the new process will be distributed as soon as available. Costs for each carnival vary but the price includes unlimited events. Pricing listed under carnival fees are a guide only, please note that some carnivals will include a towel/t-shirt/ food and or drink and can incur a slightly higher price.

SLSSNB members are given blanket approval to compete outside the SNB Branch as long as there are no local carnivals being held at the same time. SLSSNB competitors are not allowed to compete outside the SNB whilst there is a local carnival on. Competitors may ask for special exemption in writing to the BoSS.

SURF SPORTS COMMS

Team App will be used throughout the upcoming Surf Sports Season as a platform to communicate important news, information and event updates to competitors, officials, team managers, coaches, representative teams and all club surf sports contacts.

SPECIAL EVENTS

Clubs wishing to hold events involving people who are not members of an SLS club will need to complete a special events application for insurance purposes. A Branch approved Safety Officer must be present at all special events to help manage the risks throughout the day.

PERMISSIONS

Council permission is required for all events. RMS approval is required for all water events except for SLS carnivals and club carnivals. Please contact Branch HQ office for help with gaining approvals.

Competition fees are listed below. Competitors pay one fee per carnival for unlimited events.

MEMBER SERVICES

he Board of Member Services aims to provide worthwhile and enjoyable personal and professional development opportunities for all members. These opportunities are provided as Member Services spans across our core portfolios of Lifesaving, Education, Administration and Surf Sports whilst also incorporating Youth and Nippers. Member recruitment and retention is also a very important section of the Member Services portfolio. Membership statistics are distributed on a quarterly basis to enable Clubs to track membership trends. The Member Services panel consists of Advisors that cover the relevant portfolios. The panel meets bi-monthly at Branch HQ and discusses programs and projects the Advisors are participating in. Advisors to the panel nominate on a

yearly basis. Advisor roles consist of Deputy Director, Lifesaving Advisor, Surf Sports Advisor, Education Advisor, Cadet / Age Managers Advisor, 18-25 Advisors, 13-17 Advisors, Junior Lifesaver of the Year Advisors. PROGRAMS & PATHWAYS

JUNIOR LIFESAVER OF THE YEAR (JLOTY)

This is awarded to a junior member from the U14 age group who has graduated from Nippers and has been awarded their SRC. Clubs may nominate one female and one male candidate for consideration for this award. The SNB Finalists participate in a development program including a workshop fun day in January. The winners

of the SNB Award then attend the NSW Junior Lifesaver of the Year Awards at the SLSNSW Camp where they will get to meet other Junior Lifesavers from within New South Wales and they get to share ideas, experiences and make lasting friendships. Similar to the SNB Camp, the SLSNSW camp conducts interviews, holds workshops and the NSW Female and Male JLOTY's are announced at the end of the camp.

AHEAD OF THE WAVE PROGRAM

The program is to provide information on pathways and courses within SLS for the 15 - 17 youth members. There are facilitators available to discuss Support Services including UAV, Support Operations, Education courses, water safety, becoming a Trainer, IRB familiarisation and information on awards and courses, First Aid information including consent, basic FA refresher, hands on activities – bandaging, FA kit familiarisation and surprise scenarios. This is a great hands on practical workshop to give young members pathway opportunities.







VOLUNTEER LEADERSHIP: ONLINE PROGRAM

Developed in collaboration with the Institute of Management Psychology, this 90-minute online program focuses on interpersonal leadership capabilities to motivate and retain members and supports leaders of

all ages, genders and experience levels to create a positive volunteering experience.

18-25 DEVELOPMENT NETWORKING PROGRAM

This program is open to members 18-25 years old. The program consists of a weekend of workshops, high energy discussions, networking opportunities, key speakers and personal development. The program focuses on developing individuals and exploring the skills and talents and passion they bring to Surf Life Saving.

SLSA NATIONAL LEADERSHIP COLLEGE

The National Leadership College provides an exciting opportunity for members aged 20-30 to further develop their leadership skills and positively contribute to the success of Surf Life Saving, National Leadership



College will help you forge new networks with likeminded and passionate members across the country who are committed to making a difference within the movement. The week-long program combines a diverse range of inspiring guest speakers, workshops, and activities.

SLSA also offer scholarship opportunities to members from culturally and linguistically diverse (CALD) or Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander (ATSI) backgrounds to take part. The week-long college is usually held in the first week of February, with applications opening in mid-September and closing in mid-October. Find out more via the SLSA website.

SLSA NATIONAL LEADERS' MASTERCLASS

The National Leaders' Masterclass is an annual leadership and development program for members aged 30+ who currently hold a senior leadership role in Surf Life Saving.

As well as learning new skills and creating opportunities for personal growth, Masterclass will open new networks with other members across the country holding leadership positions who want to excel in their roles and make a mark within the movement.

Masterclass is delivered in collaboration with University of South Australia and

participants also have the opportunity to enrol in a Graduate Certificate of Business Administration following completion of Masterclass.

The four-day program is usually held in mid-September, with applications opening in early-June and closing in early-July. Find out more via the SLSA website.

CLUB CAMPS

Many clubs offer members team building and development opportunities which develop friendships, enhance skills and recognise the contributions of members. Clubs must follow the Child Safe Policy and Code of Conduct and implement strategies to keep all members safe during these activities. The SLSNSW Child Safe page provides information and links to child safe resources including the Child Safe Guideline, Child Safe Risk Management Document and Child Safe Activity Planning Guide to assist with planning and running these activities.

Clubs and Branches must complete a Special Events application form if the camp or activity is held away from the club or is outside of the usual scope of lifesaving, education or training activities.

RECOGNITION

AWARDS OF EXCELLENCE

Member recognition is such an important part of our organisation and a way of recognising and thanking our members who put so much effort and time into their roles within each Club. The culmination of a season's efforts for all involved from patrolling members, competitors, officials to volunteers doing barbeque and kiosk shifts. Each year in June, SNB holds their Awards of Excellence where awards for outstanding service in Administration, Surf Sports, Lifesaving, Education and Member Services are presented. Winner of Club of the Year is awarded on the night as well as Life Membership and Service Honour Pins.

NIPPER OF THE YEAR

"Nipper of the Year" is a Surf Life Saving award that recognises outstanding contributions by Nippers in the areas of safety, lifesaving, and club involvement. Typically, each Surf Club nominates one or two Nippers for this prestigious award, which celebrates members aged U6 to U14 who demonstrate positive attitudes, dedication, sportsmanship, and a commitment to surf safety and the club community.

RESCUE OF THE MONTH

Lifesavers and Lifeguards provide a valuable service on beaches and in communities throughout Australia – many exceptional rescues and first aids preformed over and above normal duties and which showcase excellence in lifesaving skills and procedures often go unrecognised. The Rescue of the Month aims to recognise excellence in lifesaving, it is not aimed to encourage unnecessary risk or neglect of safety considerations.

Winners of the Branch Rescue of the Month

award are automatically nominated for the State award program, State winners are then automatically nominated for National Rescue of the Month recognition.
Clubs and Support Operations organisations are encouraged to nominate those involved in any outstanding rescues on or off the beach.

MERITORIOUS AWARDS

Meritorious Awards are awarded to affiliated clubs and/or their members and/or the public for outstanding deeds of bravery performed during lifesaving operations of SLSA (during and outside of designated patrol hours). Further details on the SLSNSW website.

COMMENDATIONS

Commendations recognise outstanding teamwork, rescue skills, rescue management, individual displays of initiative and resourcefulness, and well conducted rescue activity (e.g. first aid, resuscitation, IRB rescues, board and tube rescues etc.) by members of Surf Life Saving Australia. This recognition award includes rescues or application of lifesaving skills by club members in exceptional circumstances on or off the beach, Further details on the SLSNSW website.



ADMIN, APPS & COMMS

SURFGUARD

LSA run a national membership database, which is called Surfguard. This database contains all membership information and functions to run the administration side of each Club, including patrol team setup, patrol rosters and logs, gear and equipment lists, new awards, proficiencies and incident records.

Clubs are advised to update membership records as soon as possible at the start of the season as this allows the patrol module to be used for setting up patrols and rosters.

Throughout the season, some actions in Surfguard must be completed within a set time-frame in order for the Club to meet related compliancy requirements.

- Proficiencies must be entered within 2 weeks of the proficiency being completed.
- Assessment requests for new awards should be created as soon as the training course is scheduled. Full details can be found in the SNB Education Guide for clubs on our website.

PATROL OPERATIONS APP

The Patrol Operations App is used by Patrol Captains to sign on and off patrols,



record patrol attendance, beach attendance and direct entry of incident reports. IRB Drivers can also enter IRB logs via the App. All Clubs are encouraged to use the App on patrol. Clubs are reminded that many of the patrol stat's remain on the member's device until such time as the Patrol signs off. The data on that device will then upload to Surfguard. The App is available from your device's app store and uses your Members Hub account login details.

ASSESSING APP

The Assessing App is currently available for Clubs to use to record Skills Maintenance results. It enables electronic recording of individual proficiency tasks completed by each member. Once the member has completed all required tasks for an award, the App will sync with Surfguard and update the member's record. Clubs are encouraged to use the App as it will greatly reduce the administrative load. The App is available from your device's



app store and uses your Members Hub account login details.

PSAR 35

The Bronze Manual is now an electronic publication available for free through the Members Hub and accessible via the Training Resources tab. You can now access this on your mobile device, tablet or computer. All patrolling members are encouraged to download the manual so that they are able to keep up to date with award changes as they occur.



SURF SPORTS MANUAL

The Surf Sports Manual is now an electronic publication available for free through the Members Hub and accessible via the Learning Resources tab. You can now access this on your mobile device, tablet or computer.

MEMBERS HUB

This online resource is available to all financial SLS members. Members can update their personal information, renew and pay membership, check patrols, access the library of document resources, and log into the online training systems, eTrainu. Club officers can access the SLSA store for purchasing uniforms, club equipment and various printed resources such as training manuals.

TRANSFERS/MULTI MEMBERSHIPS

Members are permitted two competition transfers per calendar year. Those members who are moving due to bona fide relocation because of study, employment or family commitments are permitted more than two transfers. Members can apply for a transfer through their Members Area or with their club who can enter the transfer request directly into Surfguard.

COMPLIANCE

Insurance Renewal Declaration

This process is managed by Marsh. Club Officers should have received information explaining how to complete this process. If you have not received this, contact Marsh directly via surflifesaving@marsh.com Marsh have advised that Certificates of Currency will not be issued to clubs who have not supplied the required information by the deadline. Clubs who do not have a Certificate of Currency are not covered under the SLSA Group insurance policy.

DUE 7 DAYS AFTER CLUB AGM: Affiliation Form; with \$110 payment to Branch.

ADMIN, APPS & COMMS

Organisational Details: Review and update the Organisational Details page in Surfauard. Notify Branch when completed.

Officer Details: Review and update the Officer Details page in Surfauard with new dates. Notify Branch when completed.

PLEASE NOTE: Your Club's updated contact details should be done the week following your Club's AGM. These details are then extracted from Surfquard and updated in our email database. Clubs should advise HQ of any change to contact details as they occur throughout the season to ensure all correspondence is received by your Club.

Emergency Call Out Team; update members in Club Emergency Call Out Team 'mailing group' in the Surfquard and notify Branch when completed. PLEASE NOTE: Emergency call outs should not live further that 20 minutes from the Surf Club.

Gear And Equipment Inspection:

complete the Annual Gear and Equipment Inspection process. Refer to the Annual Gear and Equipment Inspection Circular for further details.

Annual Report; provide an electronic



copy of your Annual Report, as well as 2 hard copies to Branch.

Signed & Audited Financial Statements: provide an electronic copy of the full set of signed and gudited/reviewed financial statements to Branch (due as per your club's individual ACNC deadlines).

Submission of required information to the **ACNC**: ensure that your club submissions. club details and list of responsible officers are up to date on the ACNC Charity Reaister.

MEMBERSHIP FORMS

Members with access to the SLSA Members Hub can complete their online membership renewal and declaration. All other Members are required to have a signed Membership Form as well as the Working with Children Check where required.

SURFLIFESAVING SCHOOL

he Surf Life Saving School (SLSS) is a Branch run business that reaches more than 20,000 school-aged children each year.

The SLSS runs a variety of surf education/ fun programs for schools, it aids clubs with their training and provides employment opportunities for SLSSNB members. The SLSS is the only surf education provider on Sydney's Northern Beaches affiliated with Surf Life Saving Australia. The programs teach students the knowledge and skills that are essential in keeping them safe when visiting the beach. The high standard of program and instruction has been recognised through the numerous Community Education Awards the SLSS has won. All SLSS Programs meet the NSWDET Guidelines for aquatic activities as well as the Excursion Policy requirements.

PROGRAMS

We provide a range of surf education programs, the most popular being the Surf Awareness program which involves surf education combined with fun water and beach-based activities over a three-hour period. We offer SRC and Bronze Medallion courses to high schools and clubs alike; our four-day school holiday intensive program has been a hit for the past six years and its popularity continues. The specialised school trainers provides our special needs programs allowing us to deliver beach and pool programs to students with special needs free of charge. We are continually looking to expand this very important program to other aroups in the community.

Surf Survival courses are provided for schools who wish to run surfing as a sport and can be delivered over a term or in two large blocks.

Holiday programs for nippers are run during the summer school holidays and vary between sports based camps for those wishing to improve their competition skills and fun activities for little ones.

INJURIES & INCIDENTS

INJURIES & INCIDENTS

Surf Life Saving is considered a workplace and a member who is injured when participating in any genuine, authorised activity as a surf lifesaver, (such as patrolling, competing, training for an award or surf sports training) is entitled to Workers Compensation. Injured members must immediately notify their Club Captain and/or the Duty Officer (or AHDO). An incident report must be completed in the Operations App and entered into Surfguard. Detailed information can be found at: surflifesaving.com.au/resources/workerscompensation

Some incidents may be considered "notifiable incidents" by SafeWork NSW. For that reason, it is important that whenever a member incurs an injury or illness, the Duty Officer or After Hours Duty Officer is notified. They will be able to determine whether further documentation is required, and provide copies where needed. All incidents involving IRBs or RWCs must be reported to the Duty Officer or After Hours Duty Officer as NSW Maritime may need to be advised.

WORKERS COMPENSATION

If you have suffered an illness or injury while performing authorised surf lifesaving activities,

Workers Compensation may be payable under the Workers Compensation Act.

WHO IS ENTITLED TO MAKE A CLAIM?

Registered SLSNSW financial members. If injury or illness occurred while undertaking a genuine, authorised activity as a surf lifesaver and the member was not receiving remuneration or reward. The member must be performing the activity voluntarily and without obligation.

NB: Members who compete in elite events where prize money is paid or professional sportspersons or competitors who compete in events not under the control of SLS may need to obtain separate insurance/workers compensation.

iCare will assess a Workers Compensation claim and advise if liability has been accepted or declined after all the official documentation has been provided.

INJURIES & INCIDENTS

STEPS TO TAKE FOLLOWING AN INCIDENT

- Immediately notify your supervisor or club official such as your patrol or club captain.
- The injury or incident must be recorded in the incident log and Incident Reporting Database (IRD) by a nominated club official as soon as possible.
- Complete the Workers Compensation Claim Form including witness details and send it directly to iCare Workers Insurance within 48 hours of injury. This can be done via fax: 1300 013 332 or email wiclaims@icare.nsw.gov.au. A copy of this form is not required to be sent to Surf Life Saving NSW however please retain a copy for your records. If your injury will keep you away from paid employment for at least 7 days you will need to contact iCare immediately on 1800 221 960.
- Provide any documents required to assess the claim.
- If you require medical treatment, approval must be obtained from iCare prior to the commencement of treatment (unless the treatment is needed in case of an emergency).
